Who We Are:

Valley Integration to Active Living Society, (VITAL society), was based on a model designed between 1989 and 1991. This model provided support to dual diagnosis clients with challenging behaviors who had experienced difficulty living in their communities.

With the closure of the institutions, there was a need for alternate care models to provide a stable community placement for these individuals. The Ministry of Social Services and Housing accepted the idea of trying the model on an experimental basis. A contract was signed and a Board of Directors was established to operate the Society.



Today, Vital Society has seven residential programs, each with its own Community Inclusion Program. The Society also offers Children and Youth Services Programs and Home Share/ Shared Living Programs.
